Our Story

We met at work in 1994 in Boulder, CO. We became friends, often talking for hours about our dating situations, what our "types" were and about the relationships we had been in. We spent a lot of time together and got to know each other, we never considered we would be anything but friends. About a year after we first met, we were at a party at a friend's house and we kissed. This kiss surprised us both and we quickly realized we weren't going to be able to "just be friends" anymore. Apparently, all that time getting to know each other was the beginning of our love story.

Our Story

We have always been interested in adoption. Over the last 4 years we've been involved in an emergency foster care program in our area. Soon after entering the program, a 20 month old little boy and his 5 month old sister were placed with us for respite care. After a couple of respite visits we were asked if we would take the little boy for an emergency placement – his home life had become unstable. He stayed with us for 5 days. We had an instant connection with him and absolutely fell in love. We knew then adoption was for us. We would've adopted him if it had been possible, but it wasn't. When we had to take him to his permanent foster home, Vikki cried, he cried. Our hearts were broken. Vikki cried about it for at least a week – we still think about him and hope that he is okay.

We have friends that adopted and we know we don't need to give birth to a child to be able to love them with our whole heart and soul. We are ready and able to grow our family and can't wait to welcome a baby into our lives.
