My friends and family would describe me as sweet, patient, loving, outgoing and warm. (I asked them because I feel funny talking about myself!)





I had a cocker spaniel dog named Freckles and a cat named Purr that I loved. I will definitely get my child a dog or cat (or both!) if they want one.


